



DEFERRED ASSOCIATE FELLOWSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

The **American Civil Liberties Union Foundation (ACLU)** is a nationwide, nonprofit, nonpartisan organization, founded in 1920 and dedicated to the principles of liberty and equality embodied in the U.S. Constitution. The Speech, Privacy and Technology Project of the National office in New York City is seeking applications from attorneys and law school graduates whose law firms will sponsor them to work at a public interest law organization beginning in the Fall of 2010.

The Speech, Privacy, and Technology (SPT) Project is part of the ACLU's newly created **Center for Democracy**, which works to strengthen democratic institutions and values and advocates for government transparency and accountability. The Center for Democracy also includes the ACLU's Human Rights Program and National Security Project.

SPT seeks applicants at all levels of experience. The Fellow will be an integral part of the legal team and will attend regular staff meetings and have the opportunity to work on and learn about issues relating to the freedom of speech, the right to privacy and the implications for civil liberties of new technology. Fellows will work alongside attorneys and staff on litigation and public advocacy matters. Responsibilities will likely include drafting pleadings, briefs and legal memoranda; engaging in motion and discovery practice; and establishing the factual groundwork for lawsuits.

Candidates should have a commitment to civil liberties and constitutional rights. Interested fellowship candidates should submit a resume, cover letter clearly stating the name of the law firm agreeing to sponsor the proposed fellowship, list of two references, and short writing sample.
