ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Asian Pacific Bar Association of Silicon Valley (“APBASV”) is pleased to announce that it is offering up to four Achievement Scholarships this year!

PURPOSE To recognize law students in the greater Bay Area who have:

- Overcome personal hardships or challenges;
- Shown excellence and achievement in law school; or
- Demonstrated leadership and service to the Asian Pacific American community.

Although not required, strong preference will be given to law students who will be interning this summer at a non-profit organization that serves the Asian Pacific American community.

AWARDS Up to four scholarships of \$3,000 each.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Resumé. Please include grade point average if applicable. The applicant’s grade point average and enrollment are subject to verification.
2. Essay (2 page maximum, double space). The essay should address how the applicant satisfies the above-mentioned purpose of the scholarship. If interning at a non-profit organization that serves the Asian Pacific American community, please also address your goals for the internship.
3. Interview. Finalists will be interviewed in early- to mid-April 2010.

In addition, APBASV requires that all scholarship recipients:

- Attend the APBASV Scholarship Banquet, location and date TBA;
- Become a Student Member of APBASV (free of charge);
- Participate as APBASV’s Student Liaison at his or her law school by advertising APBASV events and rallying fellow law students to attend APBASV events;
- Assist in APBASV’s advocacy work, including its participation in the Justice Coalition; and
- Become a New Member with APBASV upon graduation from law school.

DEADLINE Applications must be received by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, March 26, 2010.**
